**New Automated "TripSaver" Devices Help Reduce Duration of Power Outages** 



Before the end of 2023, CHELCO began installing automated "TripSaver" reclosing devices along lines in its service area, including Eglin Air Force Base, to help limit the frequency, duration and scope of service interruptions. The programmable devices work like a circuit breaker in a home with the added benefit of automatically re-energizing a power line within seconds to keep power safely flowing to customers.

Crews place TripSavers on distribution lines that run off an area's main power line. When there is a temporary problem with the line, such as a tree limb contacting the line, the TripSaver can sense when the branch is gone and automatically re-energize the line to prevent an extended outage in the neighborhood – all in a matter of seconds.


If the TripSaver detects a more severe issue, such as a fallen tree on the power line, it will isolate the outage to that area and limit the total number of affected customers. The device's innovative technology quickly pinpoints the location of the electrical fault and helps utility personnel better understand the cause of the outage to help speed restoration.

"TripSavers allow us to automatically restore service to customers rather than send a truck and crew to investigate the issue, which is especially useful in rural areas of our service territory," said Kevin Jones, CHELCO Manager of Engineering. "These devices are intended to provide safer and more efficient service restoration for employees and members."

The use of this technology saves the cooperative time and money while also improving reliability.

To date, nearly 15 TripSavers have been installed and at least 25 more will be installed in the coming months.

#### **Community Affairs**

In our ongoing effort to provide more to our members than the tried and true distribution of their power, we look forward to continuing to host community events in our service territory. #### **Infrastructure**

2024 will also bring more improvements to our system. We are working alongside PowerSouth Energy Cooperative, our wholesale power provider, on a 3-5-year work plan that includes upgrades and improvements to our substations as part of our commitment to strengthening the power grid against severe weather and preparing our

system to serve a growing area.

#### **Eglin Air Force Base**

As a proud mission partner of Eglin Air Force Base (Eglin AFB), having been awarded the 50-year utility privatization (UP) contract in 2016, we look forward to continuing to work closely with Eglin leadership and personnel to own, operate, and maintain their electrical system infrastructure. Alongside our contracted work, CHELCO has been proud to assist with new projects related to security and technology upgrades on base.

#### **Growing to Meet Member's Needs**

As many know, Freeport, Florida, is one of the fastest-growing areas within CHELCO's service territory and the state. While we have recently completed the new substation to help carry the load the influx of people will need, we know that we will also need to build a new office in Freeport to have more hands onsite for our member's needs. We are in the preliminary

stages of planning and design for a new Freeport area office. Until then, we will continue to happily serve members from our office in the Freeport City Hall.

#### **Beat the Peak**

The single most significant expense CHELCO has continues to be the price of energy we deliver to our members. When demand for electricity rises, the wholesale cost to buy it rises. Through our Beat the Peak campaign, we aim to keep the amount of power we have to buy as low as possible, so the rates are controlled over the year. Through these efforts, our members collectively have the means to help control what CHELCO must pay for wholesale power, which affects rates for all members.


While the new year is under way, we look to the future with great expectations, and will continue to keep the lights on.

# **Operation Round Up 2023 Recap**

Since beginning in 2019, thousands of CHELCO members have opened up their hearts and joined Operation Round Up. The program is simple, but its impact is tremendous. Members who participate choose to round up their monthly electric bill to the next whole dollar amount, and the spare change is pooled then distributed to non-profits in our community. In 2023, nearly \$108,000 was distributed to over 40 501c3 organizations in CHELCO's service territory. The chart below shows the money invested locally over the last five years.


#### The Good Kind of Audit



During winter months, ensure your home is well-sealed and properly insulated to reduce the need for excessive heating. Seal air leaks around your home and add insulation where needed to save up to 10% on annual energy bills. Install weather stripping on exterior doors and apply caulk around windows.
