### **CHELCO Youth Tour Memo**

The Washington D.C. Youth Tour program has been an annual event at CHELCO since 1983. Through this program, four students whose parents are CHELCO members go on a week-long, all-expense-paid trip to see all the sights in our nation's capital. Through the years, students from all the schools in CHELCO's territory have won the competition and gone on the trip. Almost 100 area students have visited Washington, D.C., through the CHELCO Youth Tour program.

Every student who participates gets to go to Tallahassee for two days to visit the Capitol, legislators, the Florida Supreme Court, and the Challenger Learning Center. They also get to meet students from co-ops throughout the state. Again, this trip is at no cost to the students or their families.

CHELCO needs your help in selecting the students. Traditionally, we prefer one girl and one boy from each school. However, two boys or two girls would be acceptable. They must be juniors, and their parents must be CHELCO members. If you have any questions about a student's eligibility, please do not hesitate to contact Bonnie Whitfield, (850) 307-1120, or <u>bwhitfield@chelco.com</u> to confirm. We'd like you to make sure the students your school chooses are available to participate on the Youth Tour dates and that they are interested in this opportunity. If a student cannot go on the Tallahassee trip, they will not be allowed to participate in the competition.

Once selected and the applications have been received (**Dec. 13 deadline**), a CHELCO representative will visit the students at school and present them with the 2020 Youth Tour packet. Visits will take place in January.

### **Youth Tour Information**

The Washington Rural Electric Youth Tour is a group of more than 1,800 high school juniors who visit Washington, D.C., each June, year after year, from cities and towns all over the United States. Cooperatives sponsor the program because they think education about cooperatives and about our country is important for students.

Lyndon Johnson inspired the Youth Tour program when he was a Senator in 1957. Johnson wanted to send "youngsters to the national capital where they can actually see what the flag stands for and represents." First, Texas cooperatives sent students to Washington in 1957. In 1958, cooperatives in Iowa sponsored a group of students on a week-long trip to Washington. Then students from Illinois made the trip. By 1959, Youth Tour had grown to 130 students.

The National Rural Electric Cooperative Association (NRECA) began coordinating the program in 1964 and suggested that cooperatives from each state join in and send students to Washington in June during what came to be known as Youth Tour Week.

CHELCO began participating in Youth Tour in 1983 and sent two students to Washington each year. In 1997, CHELCO's Board of Trustees voted to send four students each year because they believe so strongly in the program and its benefits.

The idea continues to grow throughout the country and CHELCO's student representatives have an opportunity to meet and mingle with about 1,800 other students and chaperones during Youth Tour week.

This is the experience of a lifetime for four deserving students.
