# **Linemen bring power to Guatemalan village**



DeFuniak Springs to Tampa, Tampa to Miami, Miami to Guatemala, and back. That's all it takes to change a village's way of life forever.

Three CHELCO linemen recently teamed up with 11 others from coops throughout the state of Florida for the Powering Guatemala Project. The project came at minimal cost to the participating cooperatives due to generous donations from vendors and business partners.


The group of 14 embarked on an unforgettable journey to a small village in Guatemala outside of the city of Jalapa. Consisting of just over 20 homes, Guishoro is home to some of the world's most genuine, appreciative and good-hearted people, according to Ricky Brassell, Jason Price and Derek Tabor. The team arrived in Guatemala Nov. 30 and began building the electric distribution infrastructure in the village.

"It was very humbling to be a part of this project," Price said. "So often we take things in our lives for granted, and one of those things is electricity. To be able to help change their everyday lives by giving them access to electricity is an incredible feeling and an incredible feat, and it's something we'll all remember for the rest of our lives."

In addition to bringing electricity to the village, they also brought friendship.

"I met several new 'amigos' that I will keep in touch with," Price said. "Many of the locals, including my new friends Roni Castillo and Mynor Vargas, were instrumental in our project. Roni's mom's house was the first one I helped wire for electricity. I told him I knew 'muy poquito Espanol,' (very little Spanish) but enough to get me in and out of trouble. We had some great conversations, and I learned a great deal from him."

# CEO Insights: Purposeful planning - A look at the next 3 years

There are so many quotes about planning that I find it difficult to open with just one. Here are a few of my favorites.

"A goal without a plan is just a wish." - Antoine de Saint-Exupery

"By failing to prepare, you are **preparing to fail."** - Benjamin Franklin

And, my personal favorite, "We plan our work, and we work our plan." - Napoleon Hill

All of these quotes underscore the value of planning ahead. Unironically, each quote is attributed to highly successful individuals who excelled in their respective fields. In other words, they didn't just talk the talk.

It's one thing to be inspired by great leaders of the past, but it's another to act upon it. In recent columns, you may have seen my comments on our three-year strategic plan to guide us through 2025. As of Jan. 1, that plan is in full effect, and we have five primary initiatives that will be the driving force in most of our decisions for the next three years.
