CHELCO Youth Tour students visit Tallahassee



On Feb. 15 and 16, 15 local students participated in CHELCO's Annual Youth Tour program, visiting the state capitol in Tallahassee, learning more about electric co-ops and most importantly, making lifelong friends and memories.


Each year, CHELCO sends Youth Tour applications to all local high schools, and each school may nominate up to two representatives for their school. The only requirements are that the winners from each school must be juniors and the dependents of CHELCO members. This year, students from Baker, Crestview, Freeport, Laurel Hill, Niceville, Paxton, Rocky Bayou and Walton participated in the trip.

Youth Tour has been around since 1957 and is a program that hundreds of electric cooperatives participate in each year. While the program started out small, it has grown to welcome thousands of high school juniors each year, sharing the cooperative difference and giving students a firsthand look at the governance of their home states.

In addition to visiting Tallahassee, each Youth Tour participant is eligible to compete for a weeklong trip to Washington, D.C., in June. Four winners from CHELCO are selected each year by three judges not affiliated with CHFLCO. Winners are selected in early March and will be announced in a future edition of CHFLCO News.

CHELCO's generous members have once again helped make an impact in our community.

Through the member-funded Operation Round Up program, CHELCO recently awarded a \$3,750 grant to Project Hope Recovery Center, an organization focused on helping men overcome addiction, alcoholism and other selfdestructive habits.

Unlike a conventional rehabilitation facility, Project Hope encompasses every aspect of life, guiding people to become mentally sound, emotionally balanced, socially adjusted and physically well. Additionally, part of the recovery journey for many participants is an opportunity to work at Project Hope.

"The men who staff the homes of Project Hope are graduates themselves," said Ian Whitcomb, Project Hope donor relations

coordinator. "We offer our yearlong program free of rent, health insurance or government funding. Our residents also learn the craft of woodworking, and the sale of handmade woodcrafts is the only source of funding aside from community donations."

Whitcomb said the grant will help hundreds of individuals become free from addiction.

"This generous grant will help us make a huge step in sponsoring our semi-annual event, Spiritual Emphasis," Whitcomb said. "It is an energizing event that graduates always refer back to as one of the best experiences in their recovery walk."

Avoid attaching signs to electric poles

While electric poles can be a convenient location to post notices about yard sales, lost pets, events or other announcements, attaching things on our poles may create a hazard for lineworkers.

While many of our electric poles may be serviced by bucket truck, some poles require our linemen to climb them. When this is the case, nails, tacks and staples can create a dangerous obstacle.

As a rule, we ask that you please refrain from nailing, stapling or attaching signs to our poles. Thank you for your cooperation.

Don't burn your money on hot water



Water heating is the second largest consumer of electricity in most homes, making up approximately 20% of your total energy consumption. If you have a pool that requires heating, that percentage increases even more.

To save energy (and money) on water heating, repair any leaky faucets, install low-flow fixtures and insulate hot water lines and the water heater. When it's time to purchase a new washing machine or dishwasher, look for models that are **ENERGY STAR-certified.**

Installing a timer on your water heater is another way to help reduce your water heating usage and make your home more efficient. The timer allows you to turn off power to the water heater during times you know you will not be using it. The insulated tank helps keep the water temperature from dropping too much while the tank is off. You may

also consider adjusting the thermostats of the water heater down.

To maximize the life and efficiency of your water heater, make sure to periodically flush out the sediment.

Another way to save money on your water heating is to install a heat pump water heater, which uses use the same process as your heat pump HVAC system. The heat pump water heater uses heat from the ambient air where the tank is located and transfers it to refrigerant lines that are wrapped around the water tank. This then transfers the heat to the water in the tank. Heat pump water heaters use less energy than traditional electric water heaters.
